

EASTER: Joy from the Passion of Christ

Our Journey to the Tomb: A Time of Resurrection

P: People of God, why do you seek the living among the dead?

C: Because we have nowhere else to go. Jesus told us that He is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

P: People of God, why do you seek the living among the dead?

C: Because we live in a world that still suffers from wars, hunger, pandemics, cruelty, and bloodshed. Because families are torn apart by selfishness, greed, and death. Because individual lives deny, ignore, or even mock God.

P: People of God, come to Jesus' tomb! Seek the miracle of new life! People of God, why do you seek the living among the dead?

C: Because we remember His words of resurrection and life and hope and victory.

P: People of God, do not live in death. Do not let sin be your master. Jesus Christ has risen to forgive you. He has risen to save you. He has risen to give you life. Listen to this Good News:

The Easter Gospel: Mark 16:1-8

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the sixteenth chapter.

G **Glory to You, O Lord.**

When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the

week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. And he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.



The Prayer of the Day


The First Reading: Acts 10:34-43

Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is

right is acceptable to him. As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.”

The Responsive Easter Prayer of Joy in the Resurrected Lord
