

The Epistle Lesson: 1 John 4:7-16




The Gospel Lesson: Luke 2:1-20 (KJV)

- The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the second chapter.

- **2** And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed.
- ² (And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.)
- ³ And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city.




The Words of Institution
