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

The Welcome

Call to Worship (based on Jeremiah 31)

P: Shout for joy to the Lord, our God, who loves us with an everlasting love,

C: as a father loves his children;

P: who gathers us together from the north and the south,

C: the east and the west;

P: who leads us beside quiet streams,

C: and shows us the way we should go.

Opening Litany (based on 1 John 3, John 1:12)

P: See what love the Father has given us, C: that we should be called the children of God.

P: You are my sons and daughters, this day I have begotten you.

Prayer of Confession for Father's Day

P: Gracious Father, You call us Your children. You are greater than we can ever begin to imagine, and yet You invite us to call You "*Our* Father". Always You have loved us:

C: forgive our feeble response.

P: You do not keep us at arm's length, remote in Your holiness, but You reach out Your hands in love, wanting us to relate to You, one to one. Always You have loved us:

C: forgive our feeble response.

P: Gracious God, forgive us that we call You "Our Father" but fail to live as Your children. We do not trust You as we should, preferring instead to follow our own inclinations. We are reluctant to accept your will, repeatedly disobeying Your instructions. We are slow to ask Your guidance, but swift to forget You and wander from Your side. We all too rarely thank you for what we have, but all too often complain when we do not receive what we ask for. Always You have loved us:

C: forgive our feeble response.

P: Gracious God, we have returned Your love by acting as spoilt children, yet still You remain faithful to us. Accept our thanks that, despite our willful disobedience, You refuse to give up on us, working instead to draw us closer. You are always there for us, waiting to welcome us back and set us on our feet again. Always You have loved us:

C: forgive our feeble response.

P: Gracious God, our Father, we praise and thank You for your undeserved goodness, and we ask the Holy Spirit to help us live more faithfully as Your children. Always You have loved us:

C: forgive our feeble response. In the name of Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord. Amen.

An Announcement of our Father's Forgiveness

P: In the mercy of our heavenly Father, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for His sake our Father forgives us for our feebleness ... for all our sins. To those who believe in Jesus Christ He gives the power to become the children of God and grants them the Holy Spirit. May the Lord,

who has begun this good work in us, bring it to completion in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

C: Amen.

The Scripture Readings

The Epistle Lesson: Romans 6:12-23

Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms, because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness leading to sanctification.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been set free from sin and have

become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Gospel Lesson: Matthew 10:5a, 21-33

- The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the tenth chapter.
- Glory to You, O Lord.

These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them, . . .

"Brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death, and you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next, for truly, I say to you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes.

"A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant above his master. It is enough for the disciple to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household.

"So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will

fall to the ground apart from your Father. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven."




