



## The Baptism of Isaac Alfred Ferris

#### **Invocation**

P: In the name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

**P:** On the Day of Pentecost, the question was asked of Peter, "What shall we do to be saved?" to which St. Peter responded, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for

your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself." (Acts 2:38-39) In response, about 3000 people – men, women, and their children – were baptized in the name of the one true God, thus receiving the forgiveness of sins and the promised Holy Spirit.

Today, Isaac is being baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Isaac's baptism testifies to the reality that there is nothing we humanly bring to baptism. In baptism, God is the One giving the gifts and the baptized receive those gifts! Isaac will receive God's gift of forgiveness for the sin he has inherited from his parents and for sin he commits. Isaac will also receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Faith will be created in his heart through the power of God's Word and in addition, Isaac will be adopted into God's family and promised an eternal inheritance that is being kept in heaven for him.

God desires to give these gifts to everyone through Holy Baptism. That is why Jesus said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:18-19). Additionally, Jesus said, "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands on them." (Mark 10:14-16) In the last chapter of Mark Jesus promises, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." (Mark 16:16) And the apostle Peter has written, "Baptism now saves you." (1 Peter 3:21)

And so, Adam and Amy, you are doing a Godpleasing act by bringing your son to be baptized in the name of the triune God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

How is your son to be named?

Parents: His name is ...

#### Sign of the Cross

P: Isaac, receive the sign of the holy cross both upon your (+) forehead and upon your (+) heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

#### **Address to Sponsors**

P: From ancient times the Church has observed the custom of appointing sponsors for baptismal candidates and catechumens. In the Evangelical Lutheran Church, sponsors are to confess the faith expressed in the Apostles' Creed and taught in the Small Catechism. They are, whenever possible, to witness the Baptism of those they sponsor. They are to pray for them, support them in their ongoing instruction, nurture them in the Christian faith, and encourage them toward the faithful reception of the Lord's Supper. They are, at all times, to be examples to them of the holy life of faith in Christ and love for their neighbor.

P: Is it your intention to serve Isaac as sponsors in the Christian faith?

R: Yes, with the help of God.

P: God enable you to will and to do this faithful and loving work and with His grace fulfill what we are unable to do.

C: Amen.

The pastor places his hands on the head of the candidate and God's people speak together:

#### The Lord's Prayer

ALL: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom

and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

#### Blessing

P: The Lord preserve your coming in and your going out from this time forth and even (+) forevermore.

C: Amen.

#### The Confession of Our Christian Faith

P: Isaac is being baptized into the Christian faith and so we speak together the Apostles' Creed:

#### ALL:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell.

The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty.

From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life (+) everlasting. Amen.

The pastor pours water three times on the head of the candidate while saying:

#### **The Baptism**

P: Isaac Alfred Ferris, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

### Blessing of the Newly Baptized

P: The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen you with His grace to life (+) everlasting.

C: Amen.

#### **Presentation of the Baptismal Candle**

P: Receive this burning light to show that you have received Christ who is the Light of the world. Live always in the light of Christ and be ever watchful for His coming, that you may meet Him with joy and enter with Him into the marriage feast of the Lamb in His kingdom, which shall have no end.

#### **Collect for the Newly Baptized**

P: Let us pray:

Almighty and most merciful God and Father, we thank and praise You that You graciously preserve and enlarge Your family and have granted Isaac the new birth in Holy Baptism and made him a member of Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, and an heir of Your heavenly kingdom. We humbly implore You that, as he has now become Your child, You would keep him in his baptismal grace, that according to Your good pleasure he may faithfully grow to lead a godly life to the praise and honor of Your holy name and finally, with all Your saints, obtain the promised inheritance in heaven; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C: Amen.

#### **For Parents**

P: Lord and Giver of life, look with kindness upon Adam and Amy, the parents of Isaac and of Hannah and Benjamin and upon all parents. Let them ever rejoice in the gift You have given them. Enable them to be teachers and examples of righteousness for their children. Strengthen them in their own Baptism that they may share eternally with their children the salvation You have given them; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C: Amen.



#### The Scripture Readings

## Acts 2:1-21, "The Coming of the Holy Spirit"

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and

rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them: "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. For these people are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: "And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great

and magnificent day. And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

The Gospel Lesson: John 7:37-39

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'" Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord!

C: Praise be to Christ!
