### The Old Testament Lesson: Amos 5:18-24


Woe to you who desire the day of the LORD!

and gloom with no brightness in it? "I hate, I despise your feasts, and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies.


Even though you offer me your burnt offerings and grain offerings, I will not accept them; and the peace offerings of your fattened animals, I will not look upon them.


### The Gospel Lesson: Matthew 25:1-13




