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The Old Testament Lesson: Isaiah 5:1-7

Let me sing for my beloved my love song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill. He dug it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines; he built a watchtower in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it; and he looked for it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes. And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard. What more was there to do for my vineyard, that I have not done in it? When I looked for it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes? And now I will tell you what I will do to my vineyard. I will remove its hedge, and it shall be devoured; I will break down its wall, and it shall be trampled down. I will make it a waste; it shall not be pruned or weeded, and briers and thorns shall grow up; I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it. For the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the house of Israel, and the men of Judah are his pleasant planting; and

he looked for justice, but behold, bloodshed; for righteousness, but behold, an outcry!

The Gospel Lesson: Matthew 21:33-46

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-first chapter.

[Jesus said,] "Hear another parable. There was a master of a house who planted a vineyard and put a fence around it and dug a winepress in it and built a tower and leased it to tenants, and went into another country. When the season for fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to get his fruit. And the tenants took his servants and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other servants, more than the first. And they did the same to them. Finally he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and have his inheritance.' And they took him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. When therefore the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death and let out the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the fruits in their seasons." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes'? Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits. And the one

who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; and when it falls on anyone, it will crush him." When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they perceived that he was speaking about them. And although they were seeking to arrest him, they feared the crowds, because they held him to be a prophet.

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COMMUNION What do I do?



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at St. James Lutheran Church in the confession and glad confidence that, as Jesus says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our relationship with Him and one another.

Our Lord invites to His table those who:

- trust His words,
- repent of all sin,
- and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their spiritual harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed in this church, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, unrepentant of sin, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or deacon.

If you are unsure about receiving Holy Communion but desire to receive a blessing, we invite you to come forward at the time of Holy Communion to receive a blessing from Pastor Schaeffer. We ask that you cross your arms over your chest so that he knows you are not partaking of Holy Communion but desirous of a blessing.

NOTE: For those whose diets restrict the intake of gluten or alcohol, gluten free wafers are available as well as non-alcoholic wine. As Pastor Schaeffer is distributing the wafer, let him know you prefer a gluten free wafer. For those who require non-alcoholic wine, please take the purple foil individual cup as the deacon passes by you with the individual cup tray.




Dorcas Society

Meeting: We will be meeting today at 6:00pm for a Bible study led by Sandra Schaeffer. A short meeting will follow. We would like to invite you to join us in person as we social distance in the church basement AND via Zoom. Please let Grace Rosema know if you would like to attend via Zoom.

<u>Mites</u>: We **thank you** for your dedication to freely giving your mites for the purpose of reaching out to others with the Good News of Jesus Christ. **We are collecting mites today**. Please place your mites in the big mite box located on one of the treat tables after church.

Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ!

The deacons have decided that church groups (e.g. Dorcus, LWML, Friends in Faith, Saturday Men's Bible study, Youth, Bell choir, choir, ISJ Board, etc.) can meet in the building but there are a number of stipulations that need to be followed:

- Masks must be worn when we are in the building (unless we can maintain at least 6 feet of separation from one another). We have some masks on hand for those who forget their masks at home. NOTE: Masks should not be placed on children younger than 2 years old, anyone who has trouble breathing or is unconscious, and anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
- 2. We are to observe social distancing of at least 6 feet.
- 3. We encourage good hand hygiene, washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Plenty of hand sanitizer is available.
- 4. If food is offered at any event, pre-packaged options are preferred. Buffet or family-style meals are not allowed.
- 5. Group members must sanitize the area following their meeting. This includes: wiping down chairs, tables, door knobs, elevator buttons, etc.). Cleaning supplies and plastic gloves will be made available.

Please contact Karen to request that your meeting be placed on the church calendar so that we know who is using the building. This will help with cleaning preparation and also ensure there is no scheduling conflict.

We also take this opportunity to remind you that:

- We will continue to have no more than 75 people attend worship services in the sanctuary.
- b. A <u>video</u> is posted on the St. James website in which Pastor Schaeffer describes what takes place on Sunday morning when you worship in the sanctuary.
- c. We ask that all people who worship in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings, register on Eventbrite. Monday evening communion service attendees do not need to register. Our average Sunday morning in-house worship attendance since starting services on July 5 is 39. We have had a high attendance of 63 and a low of 25. Monday evening communion services average less than 10 people.
- d. You can arrange to meet with Pastor Schaeffer for private communion.
- e. Dale provided a description of the cleaning process of the sanctuary in the <u>September newsletter</u> (which also was printed in two bulletins, the last <u>Sunday of August</u> and the first Sunday in September.)
- f. If you are sick or have had close contact with a person with COVID-19, please stay home.

NOTE: If you are exposed to COVID-19 or test positive, please contact the office so that we can contact the other members with whom you may have been in contact.
