The Epistle Lesson: 1 Corinthians 9:16-27

If I preach the gospel, that gives me no ground for boasting. For necessity is laid upon me. Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel! For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward, but not of my own will, I am still entrusted with a stewardship. What then is my reward? That in my preaching I may present the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel.

For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law. To the

weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, that I may share with them in its blessings.

Do you not know that in a race all the runners compete, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

The Gospel Lesson: Mark 1:29-39

- The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the first chapter.
- Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

Immediately [Jesus] left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and immediately they told him about her. And he came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening at sundown they brought to him all who were sick or oppressed by demons. And the whole city was gathered together at the door. And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed. And Simon and those who were with him searched for him, and they found him and said to him, "Everyone is looking for you." And he said to them, "Let us go on to the next towns, that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out." And he went throughout all Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out demons.

Our Christian Confession: The Second Article and Explanation

P: What is the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed?

C: And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: What does this mean?

C: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.

You Can Create A Season of Hope for Someone!

This Lent, we are putting God's love in action by making Lutheran World Relief Personal Care Kits. The loss and uncertainty of COVID-19 hit the poorest neighbors around the world even harder. We have the opportunity of sharing the compassion of Christ with our neighbors around the world by assembling Personal Care Kits.

We are hoping to assemble a minimum of 91 individual Personal Care Kits since St. James is 91 years old!

We will be assembling these kits at home during the five weeks of Lent. Here's what we need:

- ◆ 2 bars of **soap** (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping)
- ◆ 1 bath towel (light-weight, maximum 52" x 27"; 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size; dark color recommended)
- ◆ 1 toothbrush (Adult size, in original packaging)
- ◆ 1 sturdy comb (remove packaging)
- ◆ 1 nail clipper (metal, attached file optional/remove packaging)

Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string, or rubber bands.

- ◆ Please give new items only
- ◆ Do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages, or a group's name.
- Do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- ◆ Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Once you have assembled your kit, please drop them off at the church either when you come for worship or during the week.

St. James Is Participating in "40 Days for Life" and We Need Your Participation

Are you willing to pray for one hour to end abortion?

40 Days for Life is a pro-life effort that consists of 40 days of praying, fasting, and holding a peaceful vigil in front of an abortion facility. The spring campaign will take place from February 17 through March 28. This will be the 23rd campaign in Grand Rapids and will **take place in front of Heritage Clinic for Women at 320 East Fulton Street**. This is the only free-standing surgical abortion facility still operating in our community.

St. James has adopted Saturday, February 20, from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. to pray at the peaceful vigil. We require at least 2 people per hour time slot to be present in front of the abortion facility praying.

What is expected of prayer vigil participants?

- 1. That we remain in prayer during our time on the sidewalk (Pastor Schaeffer will provide participants with a prayer sheet.)
- 2. That we keep conversation to a minimal.
- 3. That we pray for an end to abortion at this clinic.
- 4. That we "agree to" and sign a "Statement of Peace."

There is always a chance that someone with a differing opinion may approach prayer vigil participants to argue about abortion, but the point of this vigil is not to argue but to pray.
