

The Baptism Of Our Lord Sunday The Order of Service

Preservice Music, Call to Worship, and Welcome

The Opening Hymn: LSB 590, "Baptized into Your Name Most Holy"



Invocation

P: In the name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Baptismal Address

P: Dearly beloved, Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In the last chapter of Mark our Lord promises, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." And the apostle Peter has written, "Baptism now saves you."

The Word of God also teaches that we are all conceived and born sinful and are under the power of the devil until Christ claims us as His own. We would be lost forever unless delivered from sin, death, and everlasting condemnation. But the Father of all mercy and grace has sent His Son Jesus Christ, who atoned for the sin of the whole world, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.

And so, recognizing our dire sinful condition, we were baptized in the name of the one true God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We received the sign of the holy cross both upon our (+) forehead and upon our (+) heart to mark us as one redeemed by Christ the crucified. We were baptized by water and God's Word by which God washed away our sin, adopted us into His family, sealed us with the Holy Spirit, and promised us everlasting life.

P: Let us pray.

Almighty and eternal God, according to Your strict judgment You condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, yet according to Your great mercy You preserved believing Noah and his family, eight souls in all. You drowned hard-hearted Pharaoh and all his host in the Red Sea, yet led Your people Israel through the water on dry ground, foreshadowing the washing of Your Holy Baptism. Through the Baptism in the Jordan of Your beloved Son, our Lord Jesus

Christ, You sanctified and instituted all waters to be a blessed flood and a lavish washing away of sin.

We pray that we who have been baptized according to Your boundless mercy would continue to be blessed with true faith by the Holy Spirit, that through this saving flood, all sin, which we inherited from Adam, and which we have committed since, would be drowned and die. Grant that we be kept safe and secure in the holy ark of the Christian Church, being separated from the multitude of unbelievers and serving Your name at all times with a fervent spirit and a joyful hope, so that, with all believers in Your promise, we would be declared worthy of eternal life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C: Amen.

Renunciation

P: As a baptized child of God, do you renounce the devil?

C: Yes, I renounce him.

P: Do you renounce all his works?

C: Yes, I renounce them.

P: Do you renounce all his ways?

C: Yes, I renounce them.

Profession of Faith

P: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth?

C: Yes, I believe.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into

heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead?

C: Yes, I believe.

P: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting?

C: Yes, I believe.

P: Do you thank and praise God that you are baptized in His holy name?

C: Yes, I do! I am eternally grateful for His mercy and grace granted to me through Christ Jesus my Lord and Savior!

P: May the almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, strengthen you with His grace to life (+) everlasting.

C: Amen.

The Old Testament Lesson: Isaiah 43:1-7



The Epistle Lesson: Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

The Gospel Lesson: Luke 3:15-22


- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the third chapter.
- C Glory to You, O Lord.

As the people were in expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is

mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people. But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison. Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened, and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."


