#### The Pre-service Music, the Call to Worship & Welcome

## The Lightning of the Advent Wreath

P: In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation.

C: We PRAISE You, O Lord Jesus, for You are the King of kings and Lord of Lords. You rule over all things!

P: Blessèd is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

C: We PONDER Your love, a love so great that You descended from Your throne on high to be crowned with thorns.

P: Save us, we pray, O Lord! O Lord, we pray, give us success!

C: We PRAY that You would remember our sins no longer. We are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You by thought, word, and deed. We flee for refuge to Your infinite mercy, seeking and imploring Your grace knowing that You alone can grant us success over Satan, sin, and death through Christ our King.

P: The Lord is God, and he has made his light to shine upon us.

C: We PROCLAIM, "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion. Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem. Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation. Blessèd is he who comes in the name of the Lord. From the house of the Lord we bless you."

For out of Zion shall go the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. <sup>4</sup>He shall judge between the nations. and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. <sup>5</sup>O house of Jacob. come. let us walk in the light of the LORD.

The Epistle Lesson: Romans 13:8-14

L A reading from Romans, chapter 13.

<sup>8</sup>Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. <sup>9</sup>The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." <sup>10</sup>Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law. <sup>11</sup>Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now

than when we first believed. <sup>12</sup>The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. <sup>13</sup>Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. <sup>14</sup>But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

# The Gospel Lesson: Matthew 24:36–44

P A reading from Matthew, chapter 24.

<sup>36</sup>[Jesus said:] "But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. <sup>37</sup>As were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. <sup>38</sup>For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark. 39 and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. <sup>40</sup>Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. 41Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. <sup>42</sup>Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. <sup>43</sup>But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. 44Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.




# **Morning Prayer**
